Re: Request for assistance from EMS Community in Missing Child and Fugitive's Investigation

Dear Ms. Armstrong;

The United States Marshals Service (USMS) along with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) requests assistance from the Emergency Medical Services community in locating a missing child and her abductors. Mary Elizabeth NUNES was abducted from New Hampshire USA, in November 2004, by her non-custodial mother Genevieve KELLEY and her stepfather, Scott David KELLEY.

In January 2004, NUNES was immediately hospitalized following a medical evaluation by a local Emergency Room physician and Pediatric Neurologist. NUNES was diagnosed with a neurological illness that caused her to experience "reoccurring complicated migraines episodes with accompanying weakness in both legs." The treating Pediatric Neurologist was unable to conduct or complete subsequent follow up evaluations due to NUNES' abduction.

Due to the serious nature of this illness and the need for immediate specialized medical care and hospitalization, it is highly possible that EMS providers could have already encountered Mary NUNES and her abductors, or may do so in the future. EMS providers working along the international borders and in Spanish speaking countries or communities should be aware that Genevieve KELLEY speaks fluent Spanish.

Genevieve KELLEY, who is also known professionally as Dr. Genevieve M. San Martin M.D., is the biological mother of Mary NUNES. She is a 1989 graduate of Albany Medical College and a 1985 *magna cum laude* graduate of Union College in Schenectady, New York. She is a Member of the American Medical Association and the American Academy of Family Physicians and is Board Certified in Family Practice. She has also served in the United States Air Force as a flight surgeon and was based in numerous countries around the world during her tour of duty. Genevieve Kelley is a federal fugitive, wanted by the U.S.

Marshals Service for Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution.

Scott David Kelley is the stepfather of Mary Nunes. He is a former school teacher from New Hampshire, and is also a federal fugitive, wanted by the U.S. Marshals Service for Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution.

International EMS providers should be aware that Genevieve San Martin may still be practicing medicine under an assumed name and identity in a Spanish-speaking country outside of the United States.

All EMS providers should be aware that these individuals may now be living under new and assumed identities.
